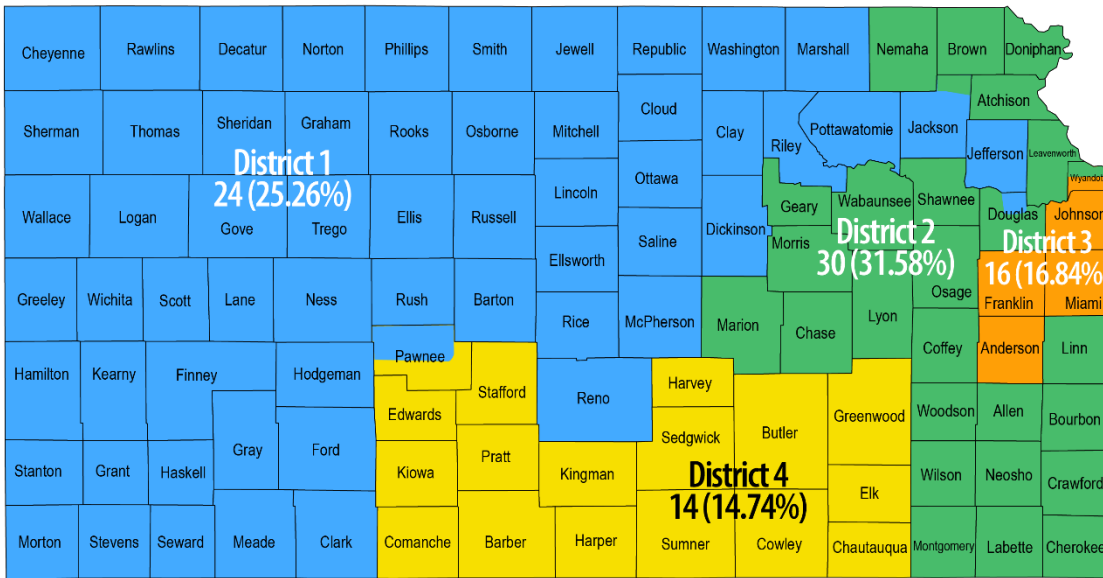

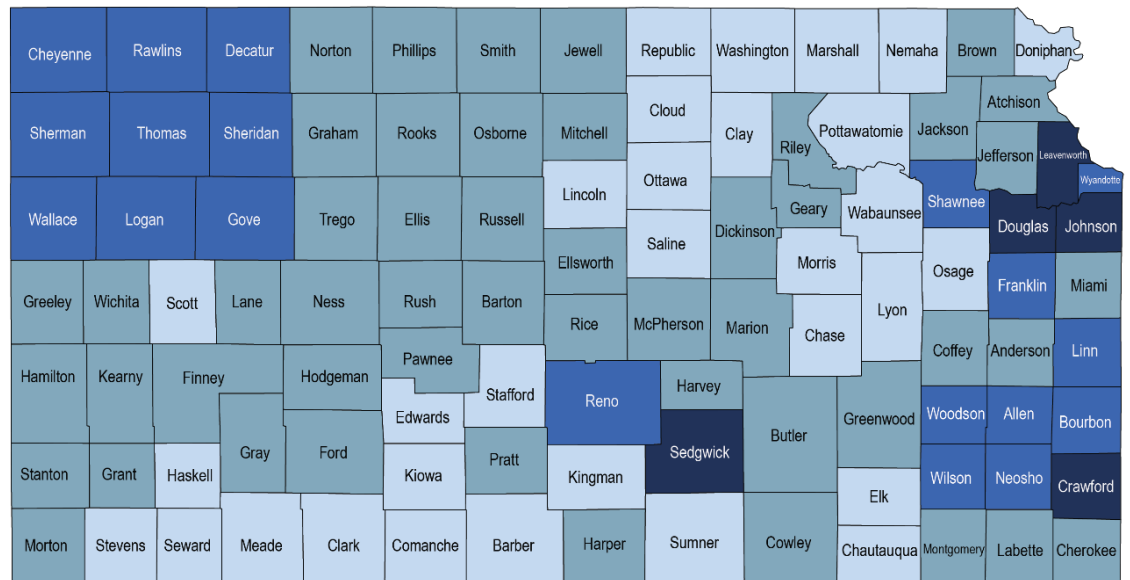


Kansas Congressional Districts the 59 KFA Awards Proposed to Serve

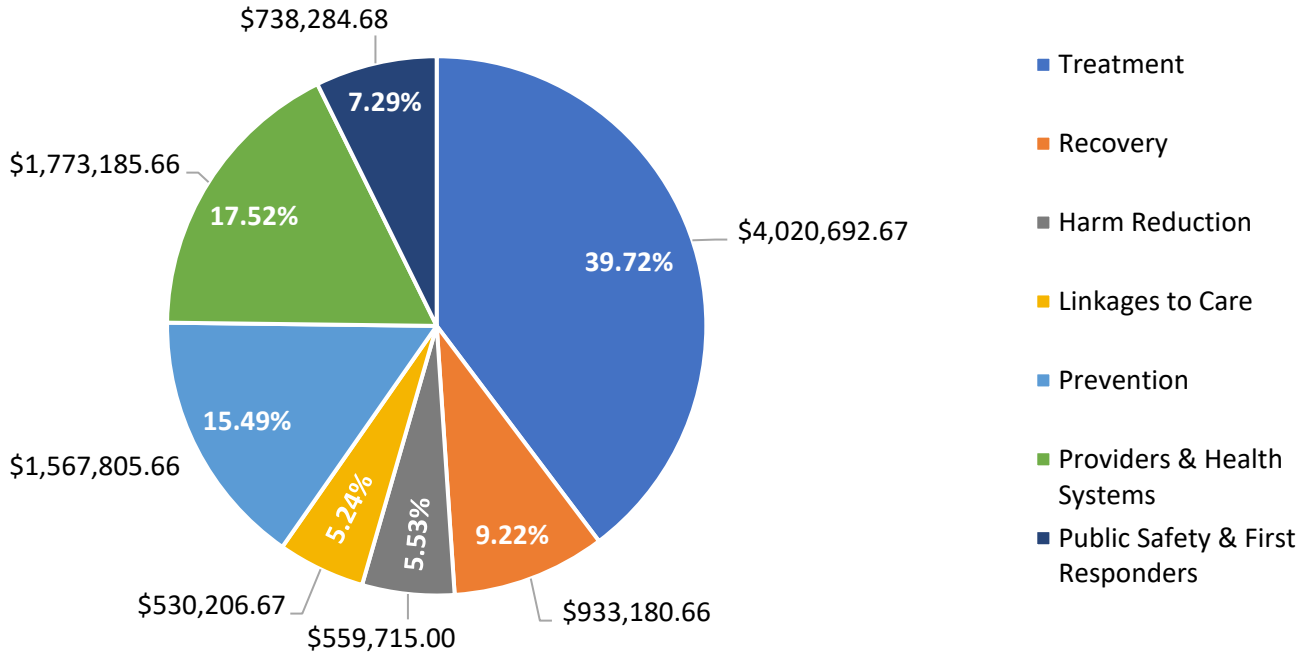

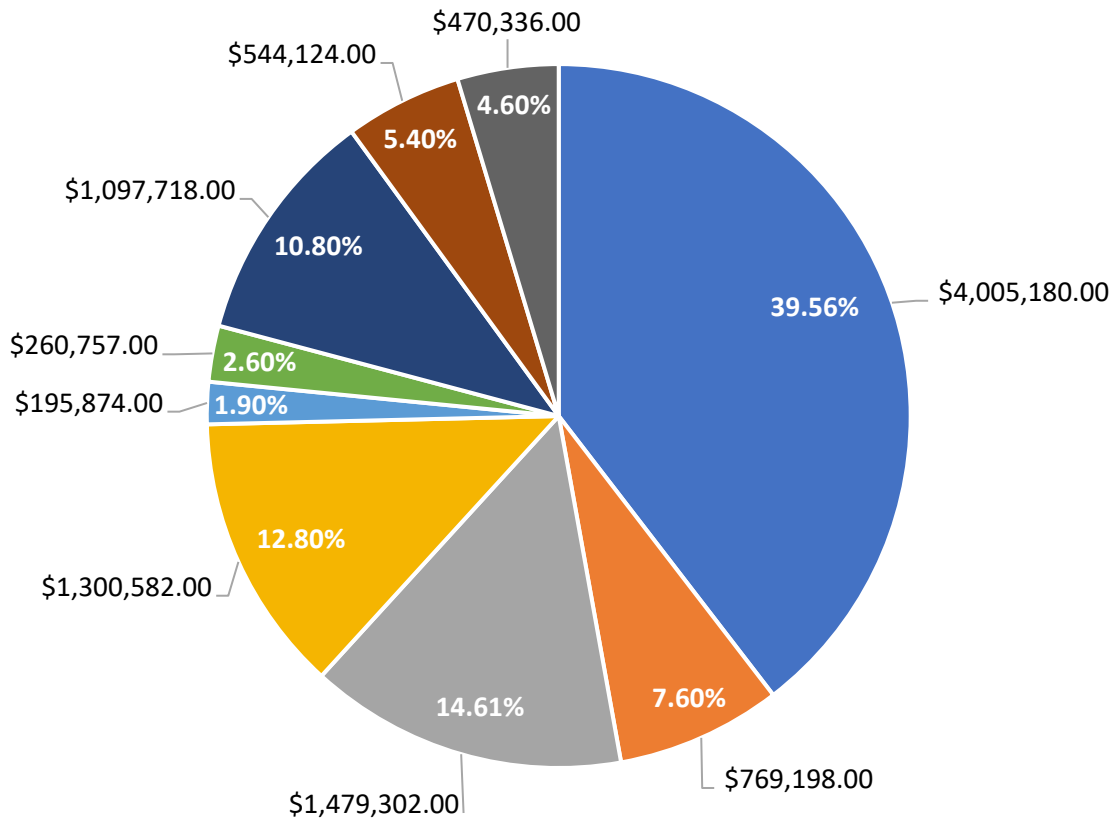

Estimated Budget per Priority Area - All Awards

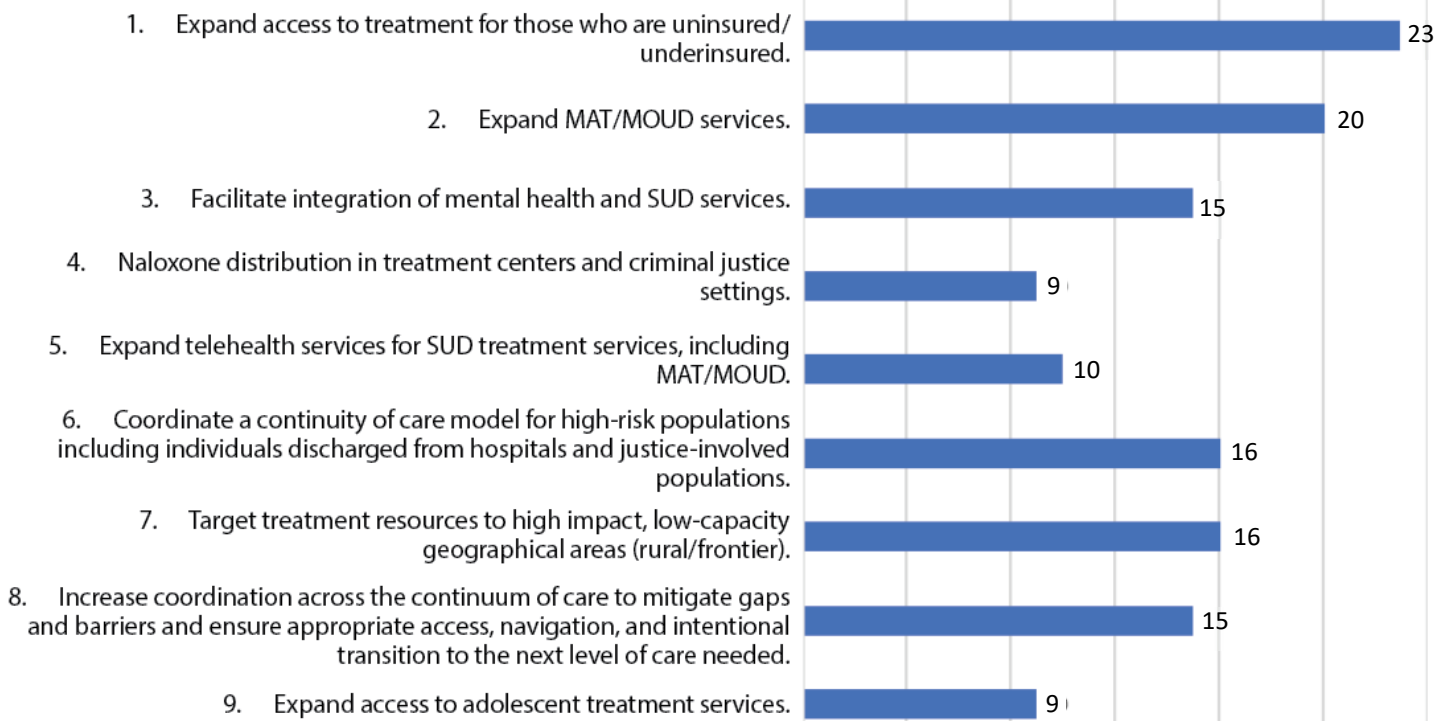


Total Awarded by Budget Category - All Awards

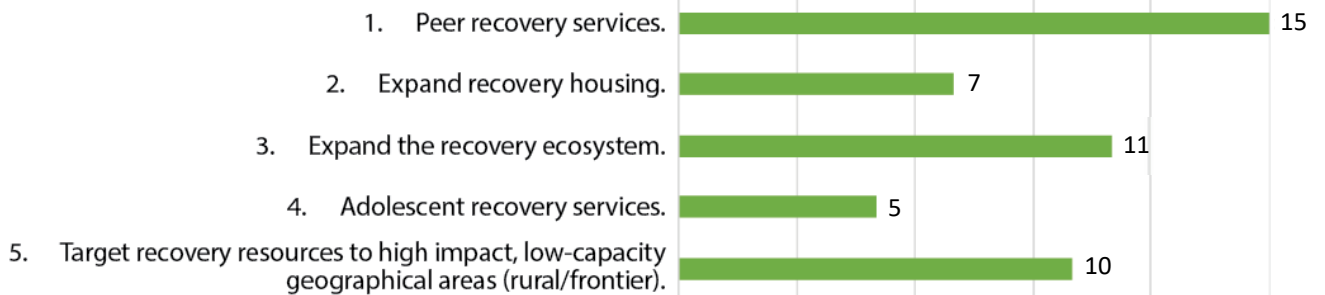

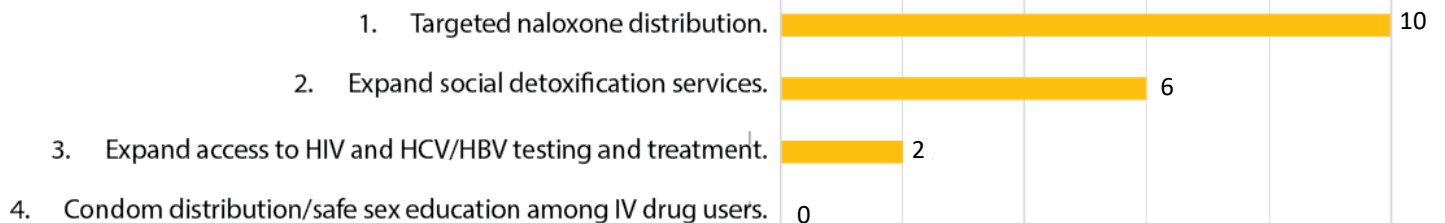

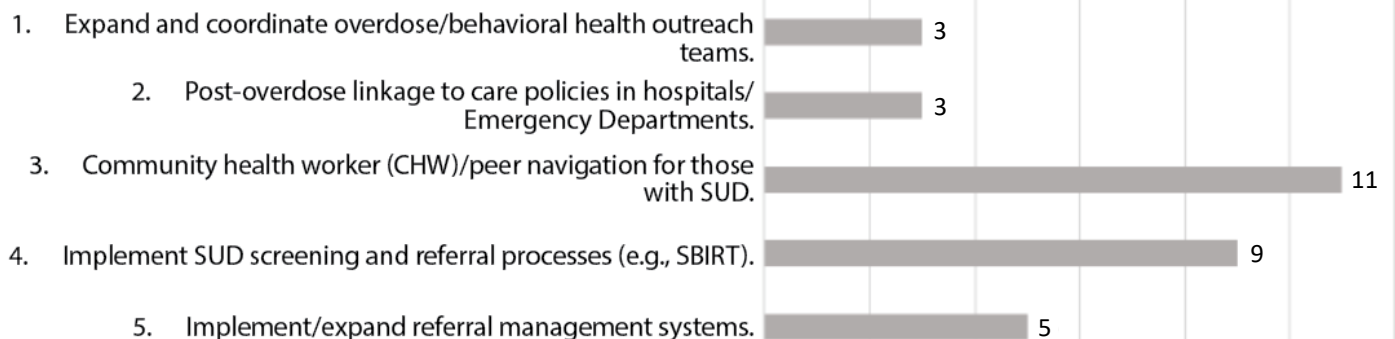
Recovery Strategies Proposed to Address



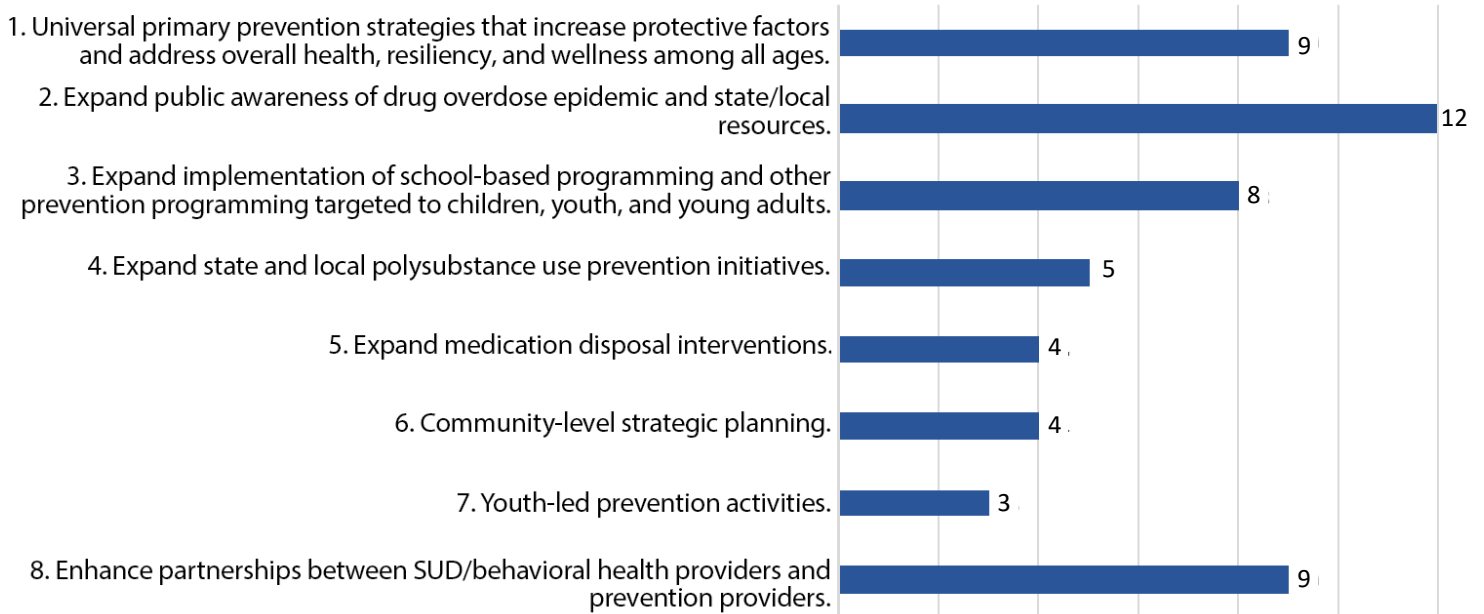
Harm Reduction Strategies Proposed to Address



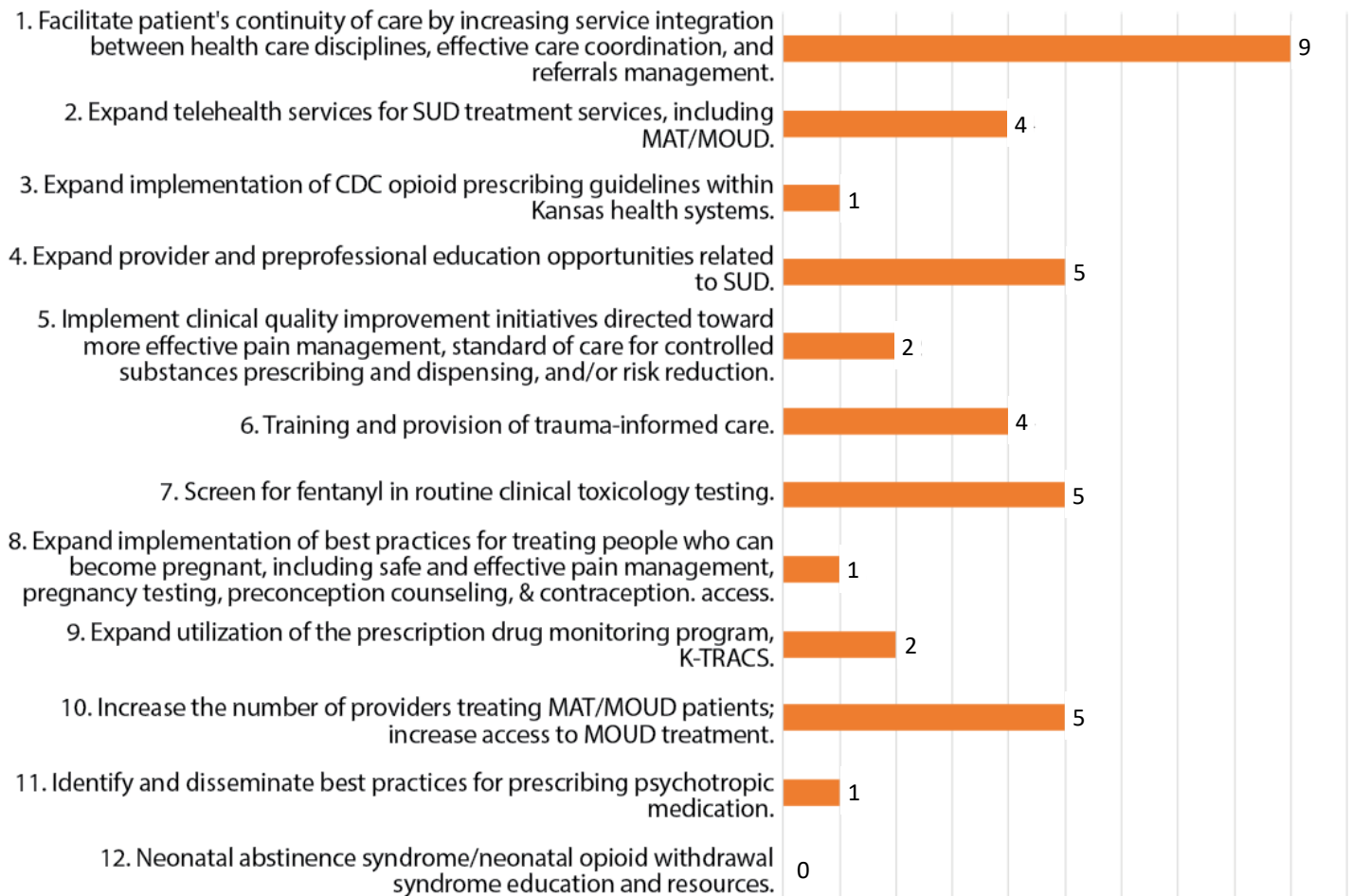
Linkage to Care Strategies Proposed to Address



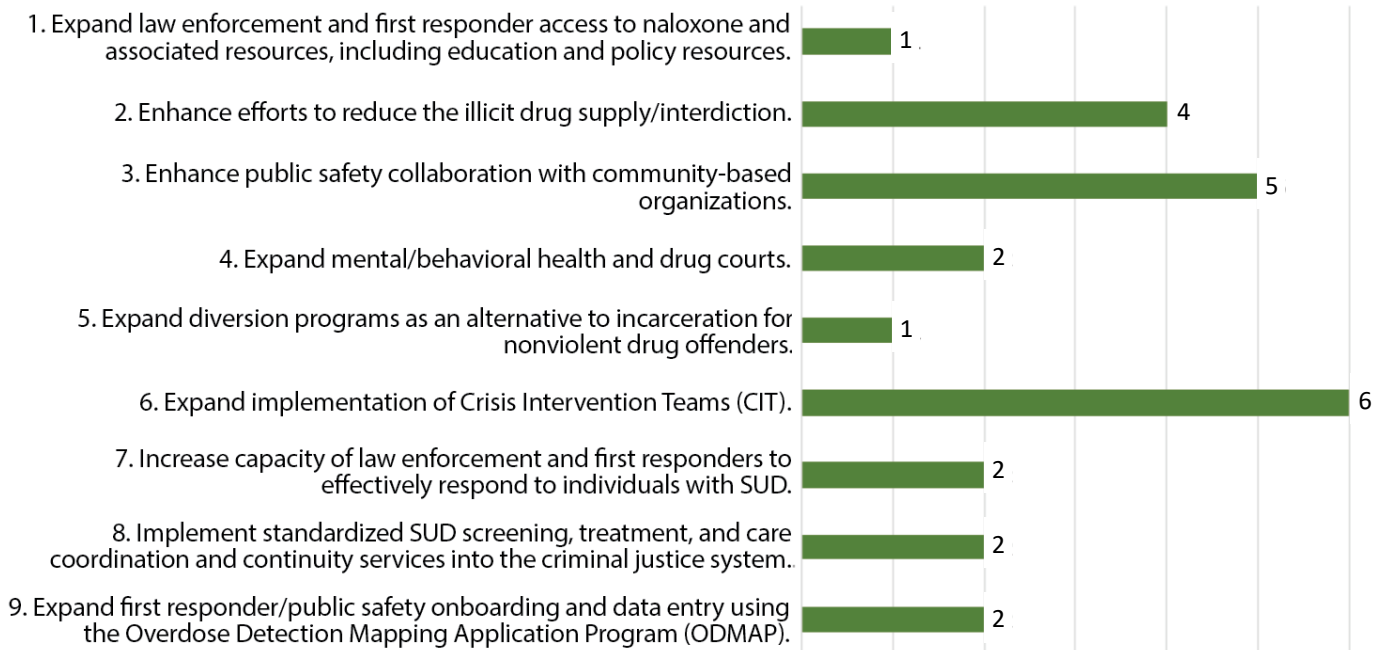

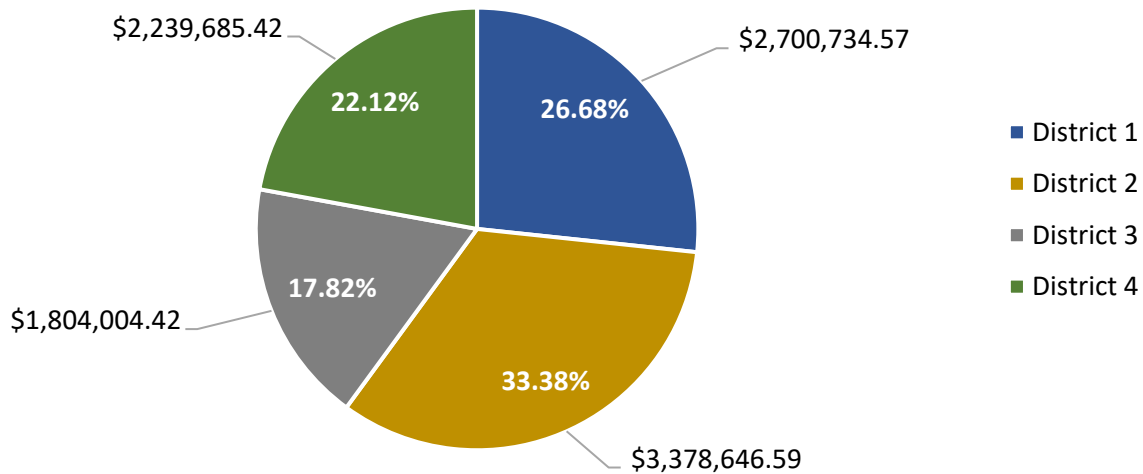

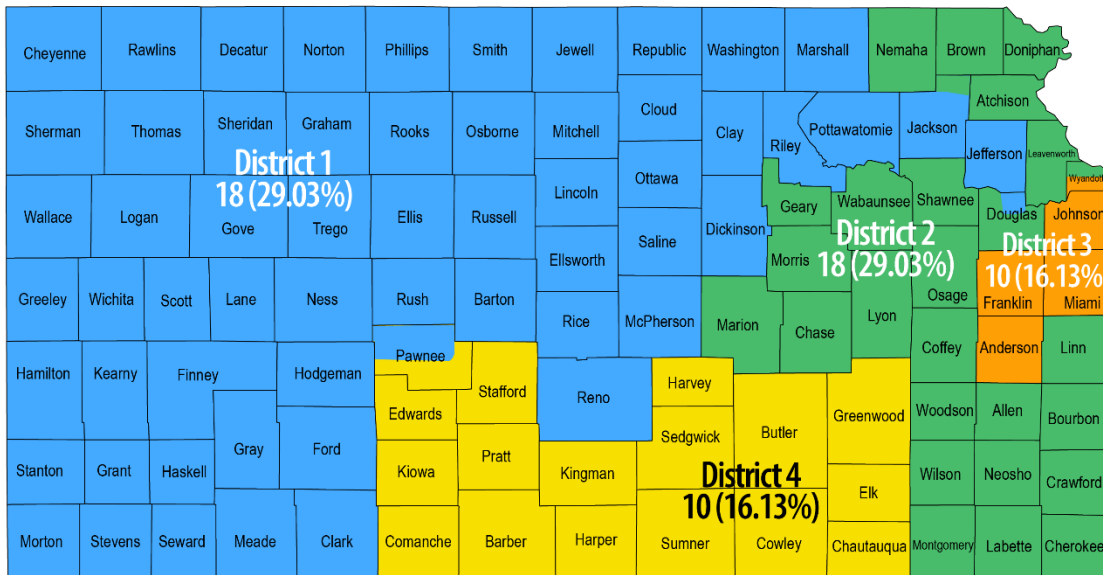

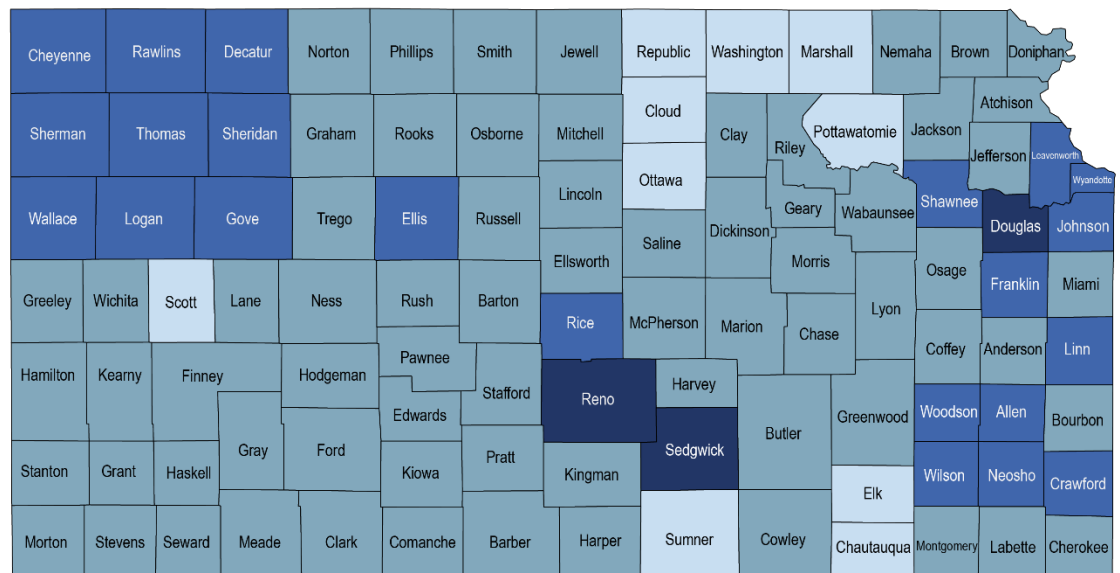

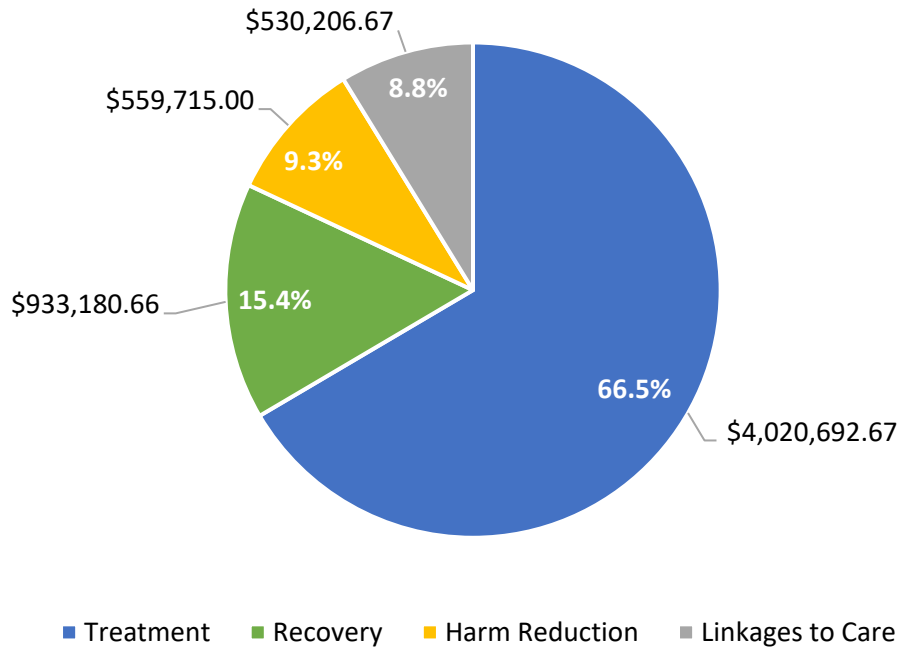

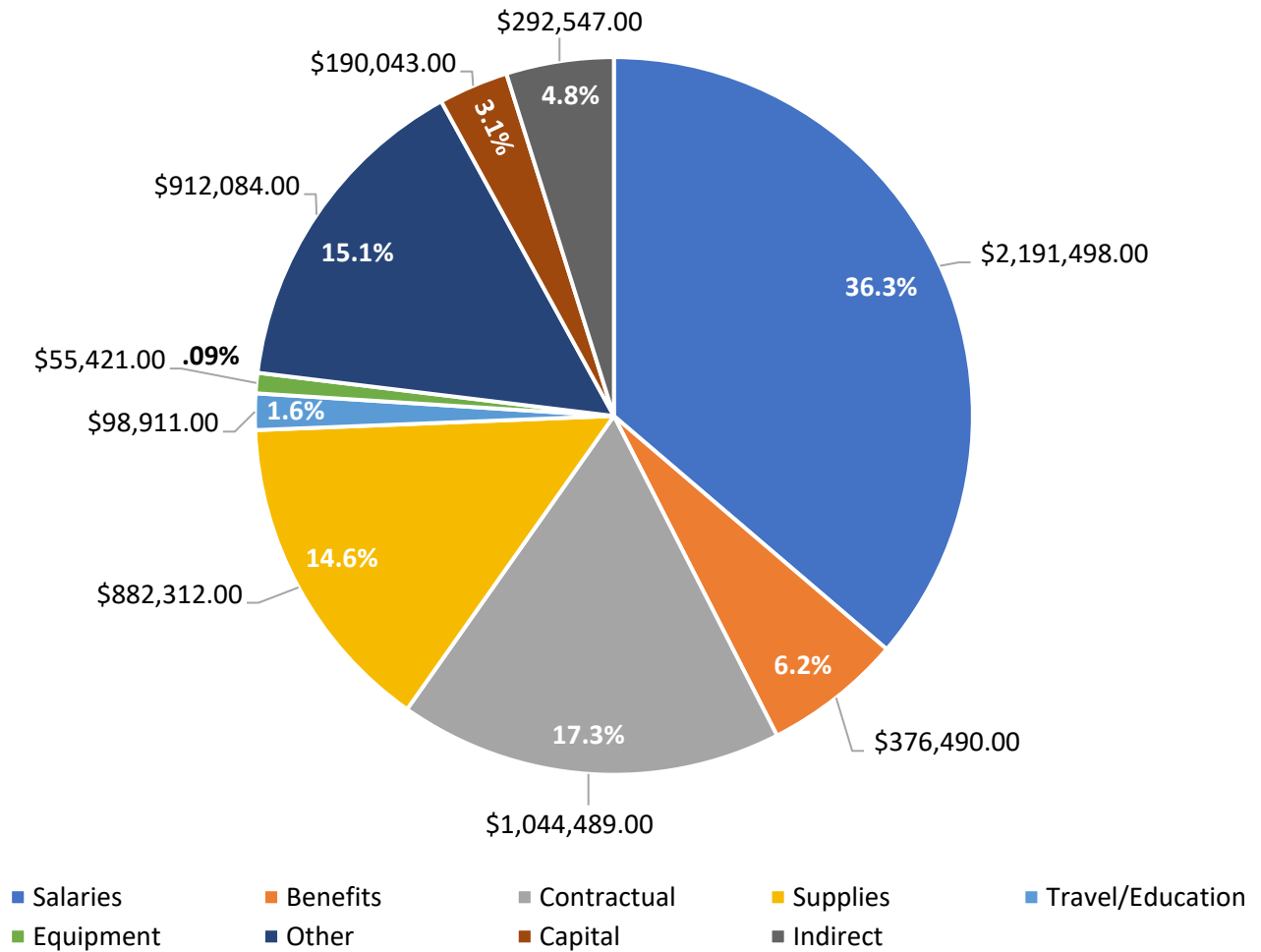

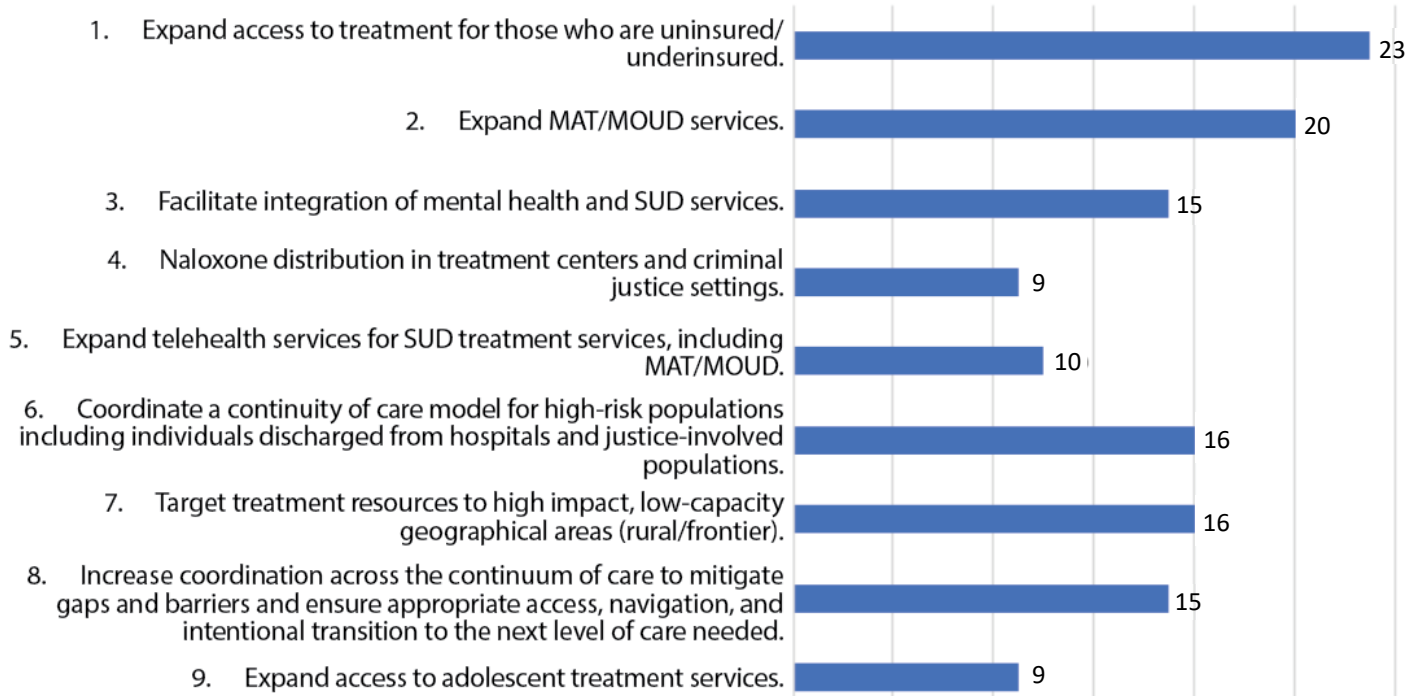
Estimated Budget per Priority Area - 35 Treatment Awards



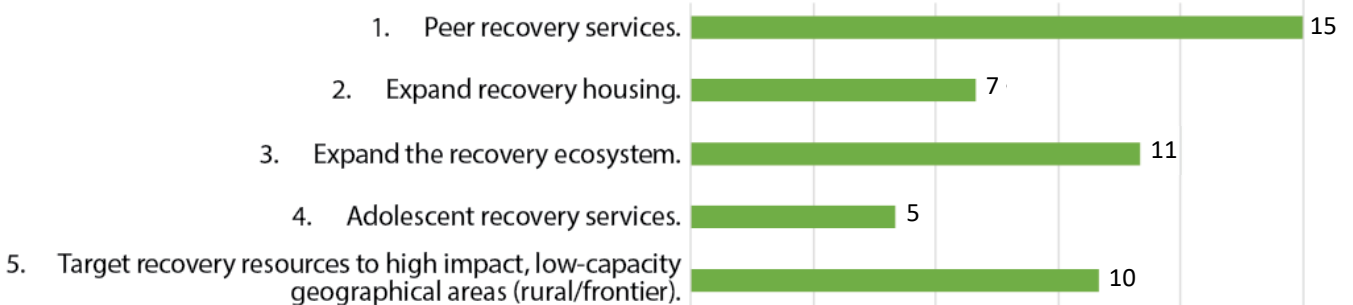
Total Awarded by Budget Category - 35 Treatment Awards



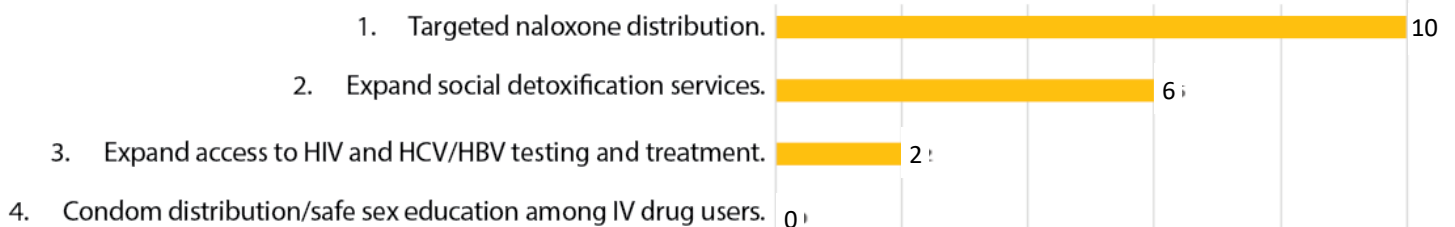

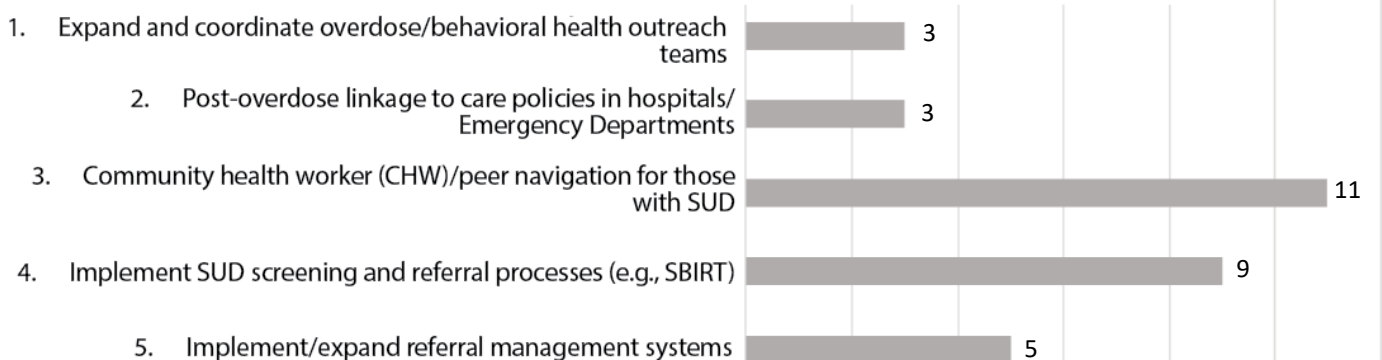
Recovery Strategies Proposed to Address



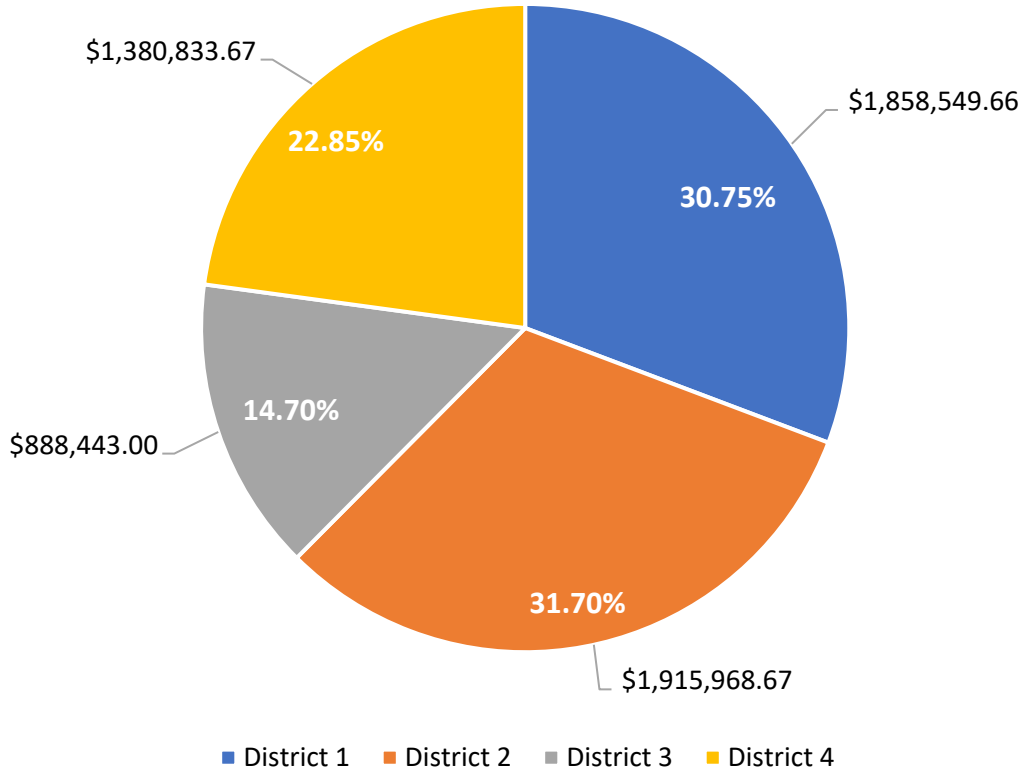
Harm Reduction Strategies Proposed to Address

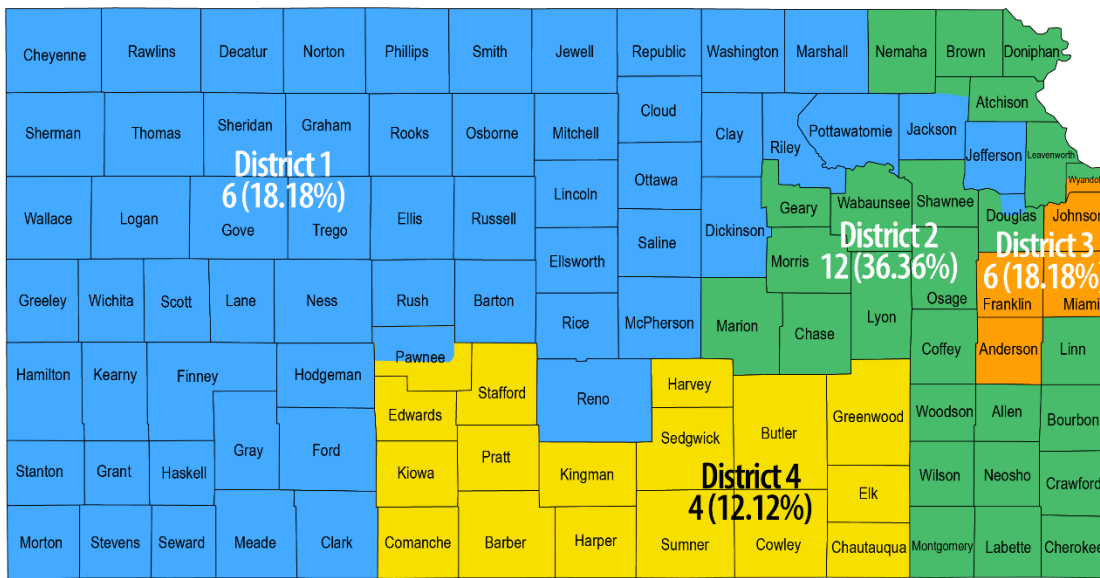

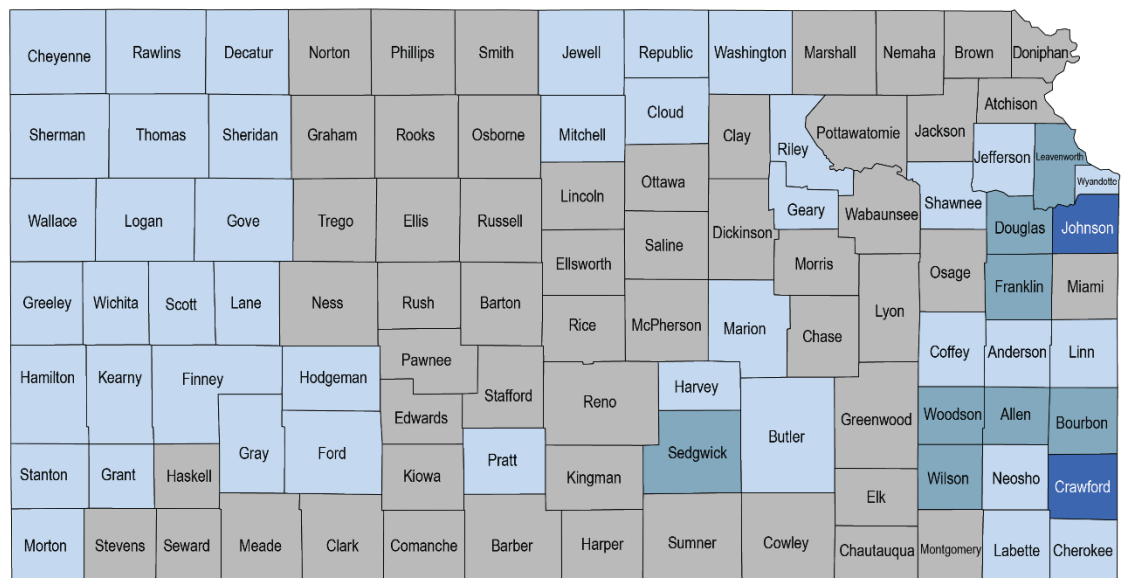

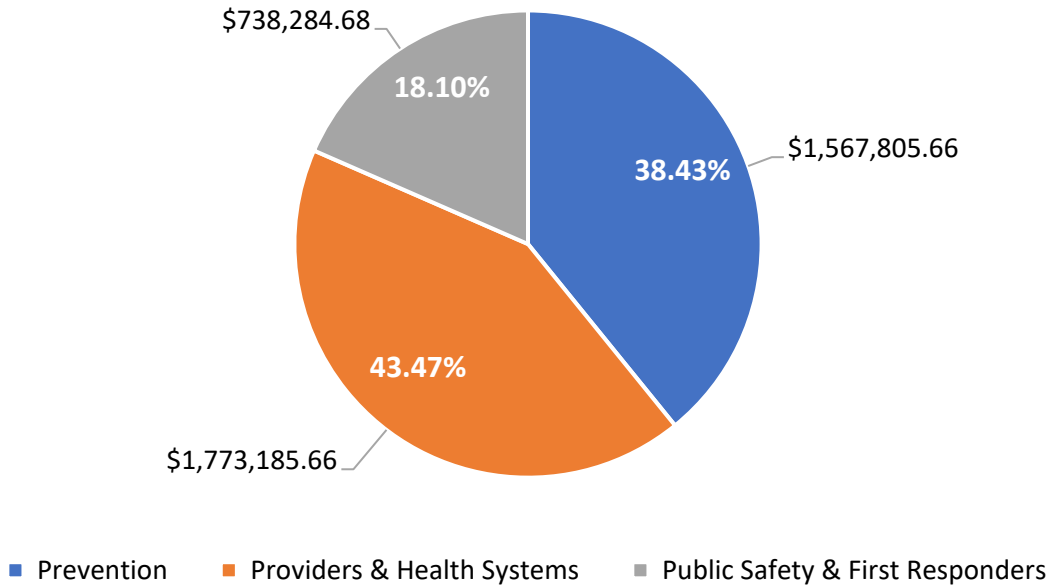

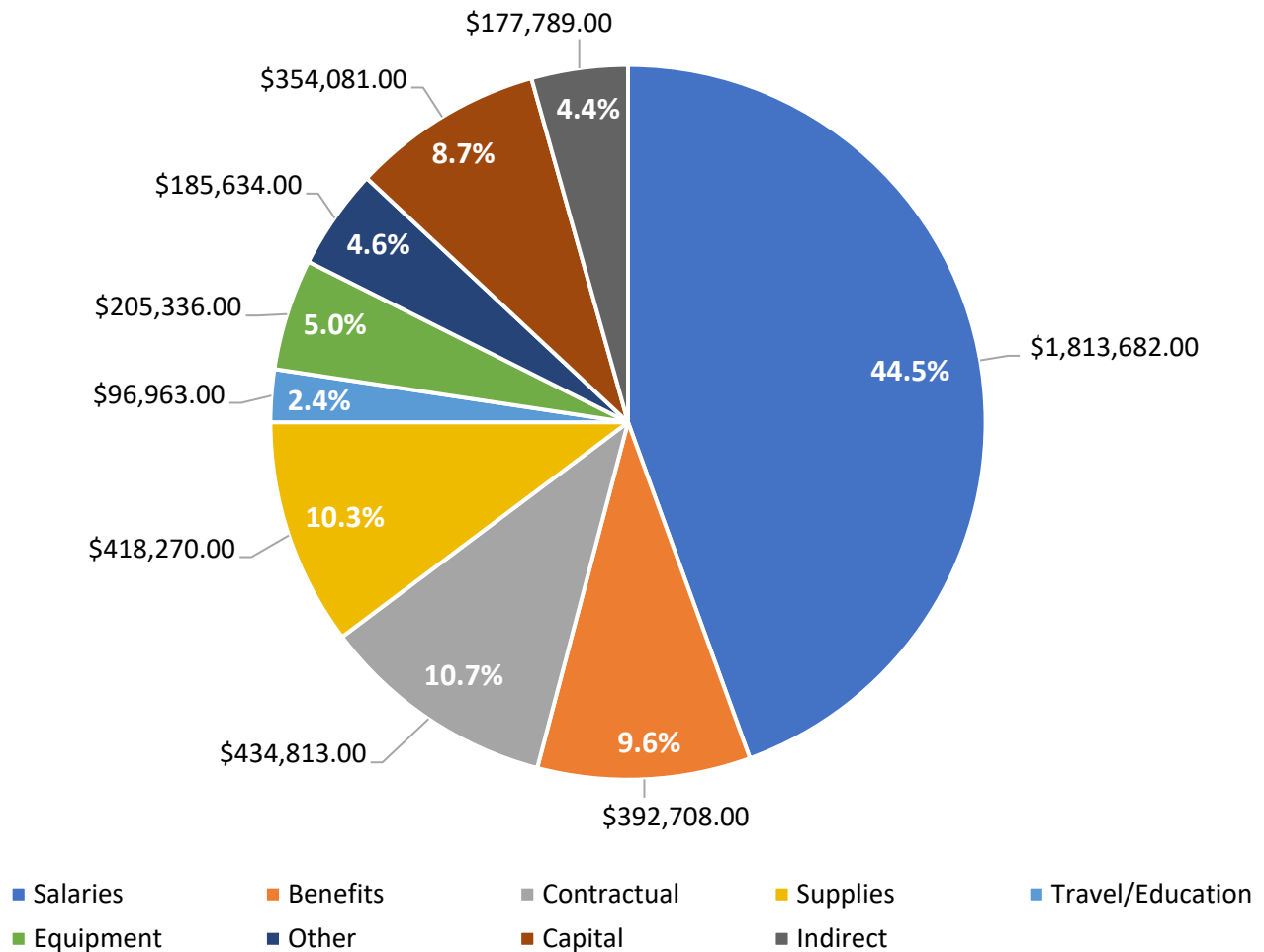

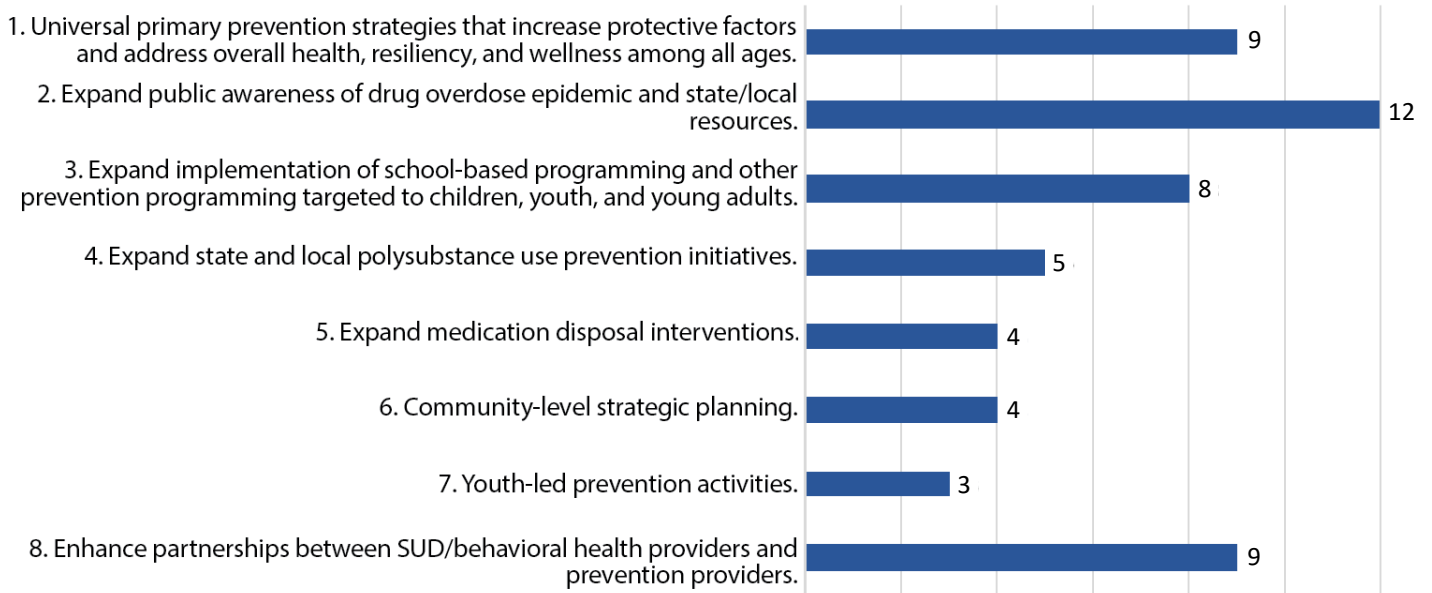
Estimated Budget per Priority Area - 24 Prevention Awards



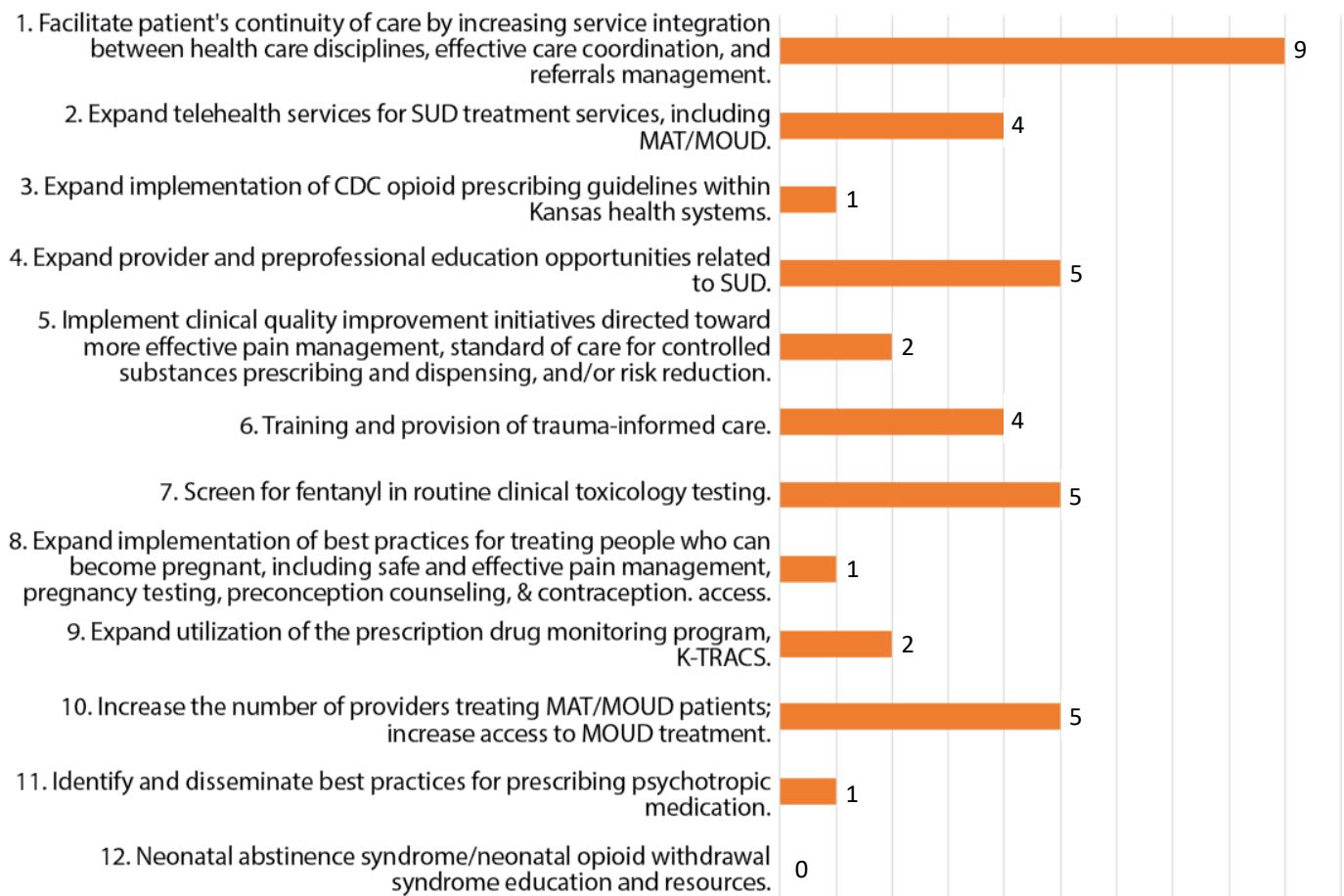
Total Awarded by Budget Category - 24 Prevention Awards



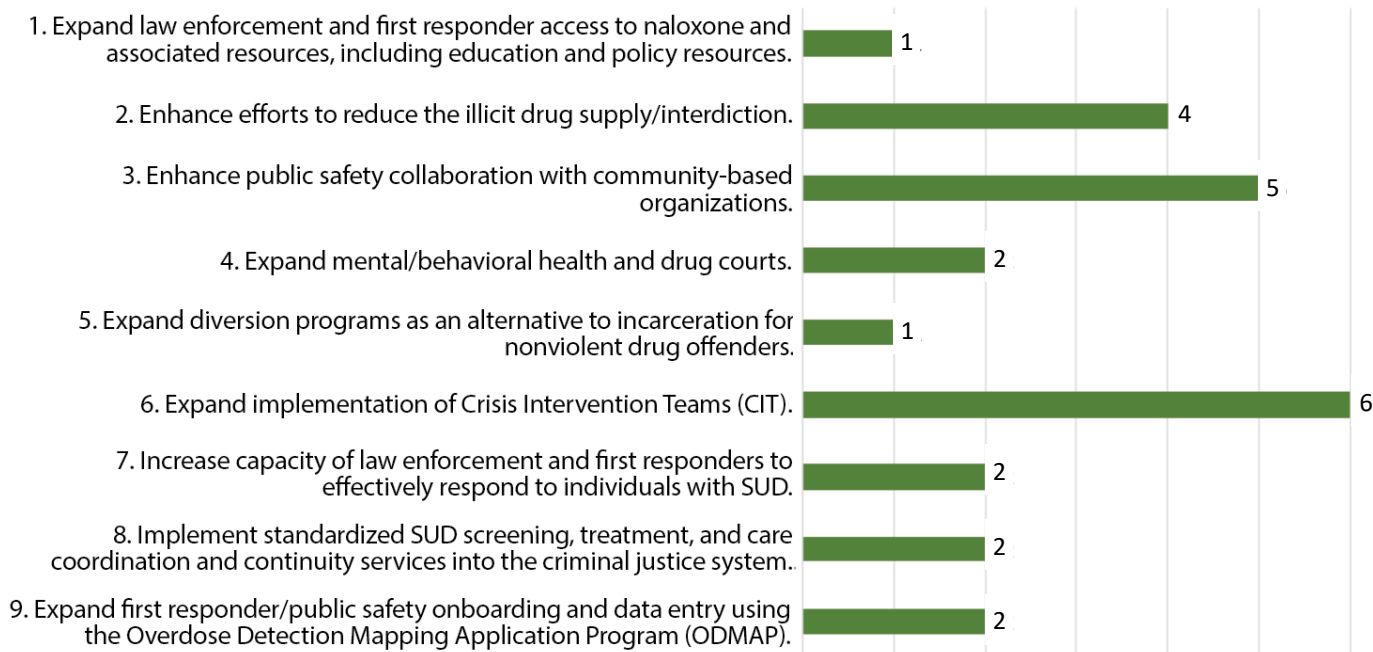

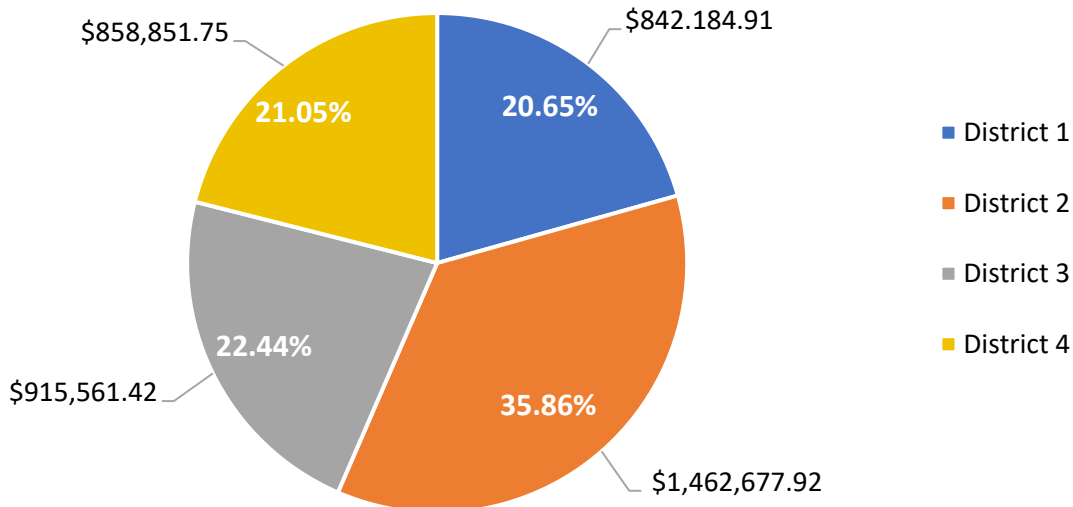
Providers & Health Systems Strategies Proposed to Address
