
### **Estimated Budget per Priority Area - All Awards**






### **Recovery Strategies Proposed to Address**




### Harm Reduction Strategies Proposed to Address










### **Estimated Budget per Priority Area - 35 Treatment Awards**








### **Estimated Budget per Priority Area - 24 Prevention Awards**




**Total Awarded by Budget Category - 24 Prevention Awards** 






