

About the Tribe

- The Iowa Tribe of Kansas and Nebraska is also known as Ioway or Báxoje.
- About 4900 tribal members across the country
- For centuries have had an economy based in trade and agriculture.
- Agricultural products embed tradition through our traditional ecological knowledge
- Tribally-operated clinic (638 clinic) serving both the loway and Sac and Fox people



About the Project


- Funding is from American Heart Association from UnitedHealthcare
- The grant is a 1 year timeline, with the subgrant timeline of 7 months.



Implementation Plans

- Tribe received the grant.
- Clinic is the lead organization alongside Chief of Staff.
- loway Farms will grow the food.
- Medical providers will determine the eligible diagnoses and hand out prescription.
- Grandview Oil will distribute the food.
- Other supports:

Education and cooking classes Youth engagement Social work Culturally relevant foods and other medicines Gardening and sustainability
